March was a fun month for us! Our kiddos are very interested in transportation, and we spent the first part of the month exploring things with wheels. We rearranged the classroom to hold shelves full of trucks and cars, fire trucks and police cars, and even school buses. We built train tracks, and practiced negotiating, turn taking and sharing fair amounts of trains. We rode tricycles outside and even had fun rolling spare tires across the bark chips and down slides. The kids quickly realized that wheels are shaped like circles, so we finished the month exploring the shapes all around us. We painted with plastic shapes, went on shape hunts around the playground, made shape collages with glue, and played with a variety of shape toys in the classroom. The kids are very excited to notice new and familiar shapes around them.
